Characteristics of the student body

Good Samaritan College is a co-educational special assistance school for secondary students. The School had 63 students enrolled in 2023, with 31 being male and 32 being female.

Within the student population, 30% identified as Indigenous and 13% had a language background other than English.

The School's Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage (ICSEA) score was 933 (Australian average is 1000), with 11% being in the top quartile, 44% in bottom quartile and 16% and 11% being in the middle two quartiles.

Description of how non-attendance of students is managed by the school

All young people can be collected by a Good Samaritan College bus daily.

The preferred method for notifying the college about absences is via the Sentral app. Young people and their parents/guardians are also provided with the school mobile number, the school number and the college email address at the beginning of each year. Some carers do communicate absences through these other mediums.

School attendance is monitored via roll-marking and at fortnightly student meetings and success planning meetings (personalised learning plans).

If absenteeism is an ongoing issue, the principal or the young person's success coach telephones the parent/guardian to discuss the concern. Members of the welfare team conduct home visits if absenteeism persists after this initial communication.

If further support or follow up is required, an organised face to face meeting may be organised by the principal, Counsellor and/or the success coach.

In 2024, four Year 12 completers from Good Samaritan College (Toowoomba) were engaged in education, training or employment in the year after they completed school.



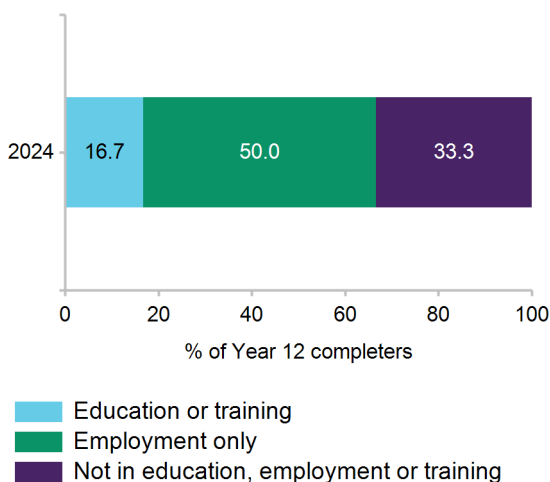
One respondent continued in education and training, studying a VET certificate.
